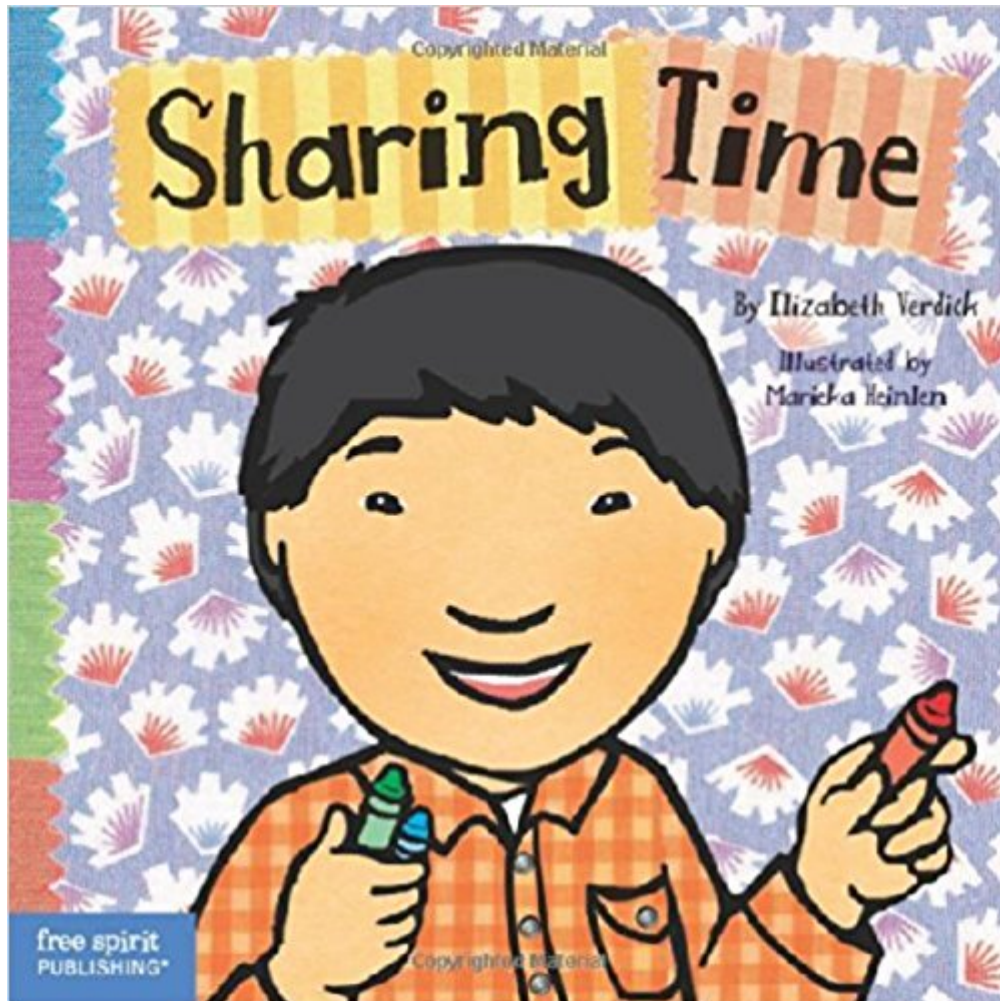

I was given this as a gift, and then have since gifted it to friends with small kids. I love how it is a quick read, straight to the point, but really drives home the point of sharing. My daughter really enjoys books and when we are talking about sharing she will often repeat the phrase "Sharing is kind and Caring" which I think is a nice message. I have a few other manners/emotions books from this group and they are all really nice. Plus the kids LOVE to read them, they pick them out on their own so that is nice as well. Also recommend "On the Go Time".

This book has helped teach my 3 year old lessons on sharing. He now uses "sharing words" and copes with being told no a little better. It starts out talking about sharing smiles and hugs, then sharing toys and playing together and taking turns. It shows how some kids like to share and others don't and how to use nice words when asking to share, and how to deal with being told no. He reads it over and over every day. The last page has some tips for parents on helping your child learn to share. Highly recommended for those who struggle with sharing issues.

This whole series of books are fantastic. We are foster parents and they are the same ones that our toddlers' therapist uses with them. I love that we can have a set to reinforce what she's teaching them in the way they are familiar with!

We love this book. My 2 and 3 yr olds are learning better ways to deal with sharing than screaming. I think my 3 yr old is finally getting it. My 2 yr old... not so much, lol.

My 2 year old almost has this book memorized and he recites it during the day sometimes. Today he told me, "Mama, sharing is kind and caring." To me that was worth \$5!
