

The text is very well written, even-handed in tone, and rich in references to major scholarship in the field. My only complaints are (1) that the power-point presentations are short on maps and illustrations, and (2) there is no map of contemporary Africa at the beginning of the text to accompany and provide a point of reference for the chapter on Ancestral Africa.
