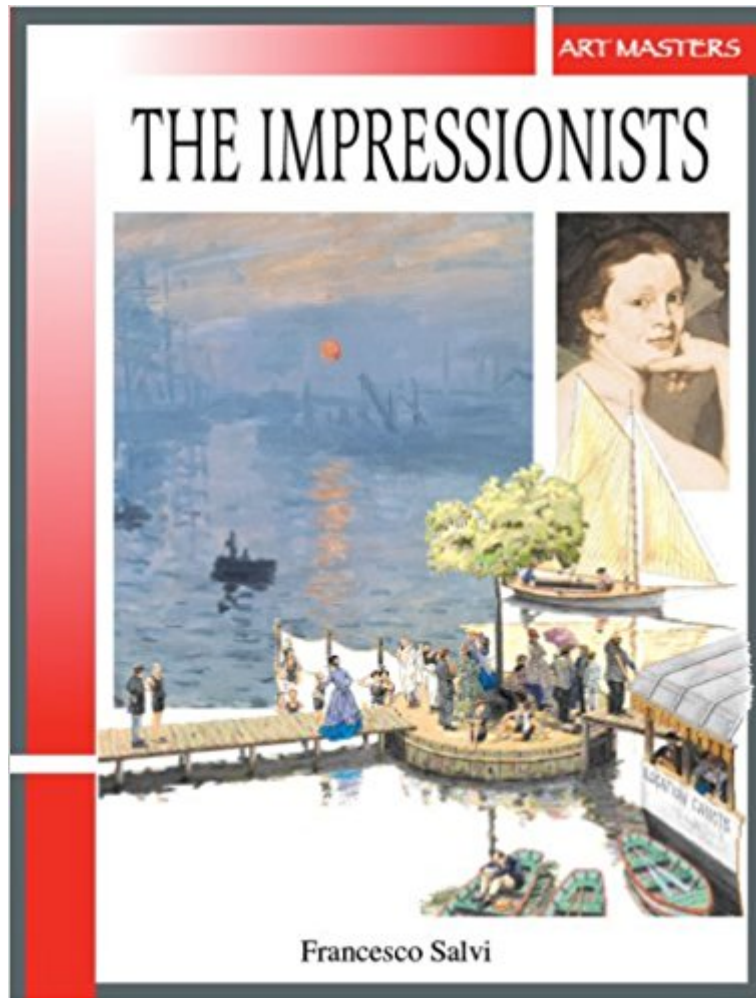

Books in the Art Masters series (formerly the Masters of Arts series, which appeared in the 1990s from a different publisher) have been substantially revised. The original trim size has been reduced, jackets removed, and texts revamped to be more accessible to middle-graders. Like other series revisions, this one retains all the original visuals, including a central, detailed illustration of a scene from the impressionists' era surrounded by thumbnail photos, engravings, and plenty of art reproductions. The reduction in size results in some frustratingly tiny images and typefaces, but such sacrifices may be justified by improved portability for report writers. The advantages of the text

revision are less debatable: SalviÃ©s academic jargon has been toned down, pronunciations for French words added, and whole passages replaced to provide fuller context about impressionismÃ©s development and legacy. A glossary and a Web site list now conclude (unfortunately, at the expense of the earlier bookÃ©s nice summary of museums and galleries with strong impressionism collections). Color artwork on every page reveals the history of the Impressionist style, the identities of the famous French artists who pioneered it, and their legacy on subsequent creators. "In 1855, Paris hosted the Universal Exposition, which featured the largest exhibition of painting ever seen at that time. It exposed the future Impressionists to artists like Gustave Courbet, who inspired them to look at art in new ways. The old medieval Paris was a thing of the past, and as far as the Impressionists were concerned, so was traditional art." A top-notch resource for learning and discovery, enthusiastically recommended for school and library children's collections along with the rest of the informative and enriching "Art Masters" series.

You might be familiar with the earlier Peter Bedrick editions of these books, which were published in the mid-1990s. The series has been revised, making the books more accessible to younger readers.

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
