

This unusual and exemplary manual focuses on the process of writing one's own play. Most books of this ilk give innumerable pages to plot points, action curves, and formal presentation but little to the basic concerns of novice writers, such as outlining character and plot, filling in those outlines, and dealing with a case of writer's block. This book addresses all these concerns with clear instructions and exercises, providing a simple and warm discussion of the whole process. Classics in the field of screen writing, e.g., Edward Dmytryk's *On Screen Writing* (Focal Pr., 1985) or Syd Field's *Screenplay* (Dell, 1984. pap.) , concentrate on what the industry expects in form and content rather than on the more practical aspects of writing and marketing a play.
