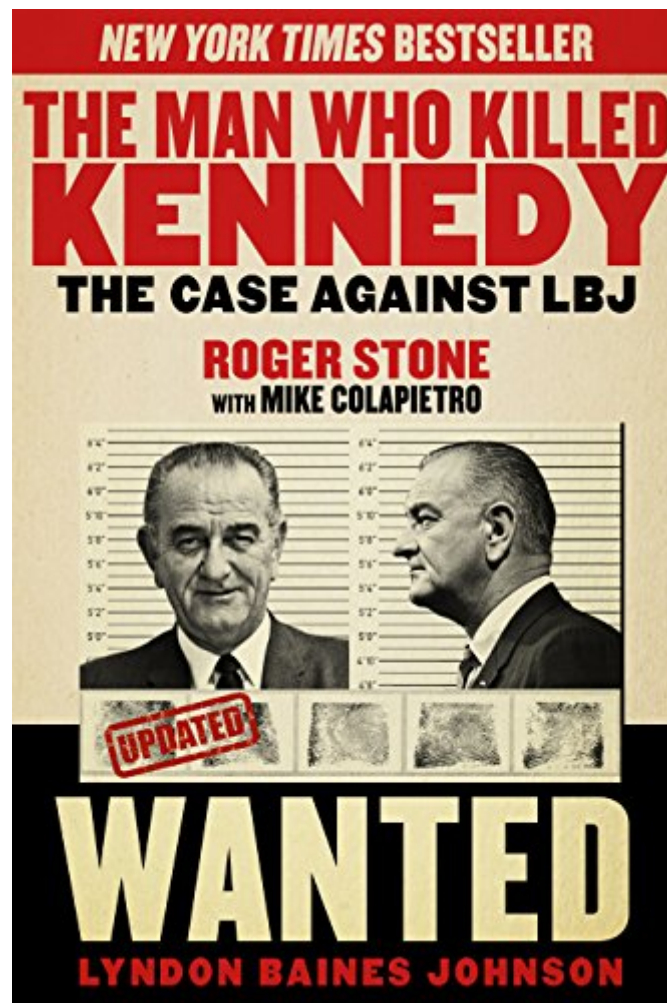

Even with out the copious notes after every chapter, the simple logic of this book is amazing. I had never heard of, or thought that Johnson was involved. No more. This book destroys every inane wisp of rational from the parties involved in the cover up. I was both enthralled and mortified while reading this book. This is a must read for anyone who was dubious of any previous explanations.

This account blows earlier accounts of the Kennedy assassination, including the Warren Commission, right out of the water. Stunningly documented and detailed, it is amazing that this book has not received massive media coverage. The variety of factions involved in the plot are named, including not only LBJ but many others who conspired to bring down the President, including Herbert Hoover, the mafia, the CIA, the FBI, Texas Oil men, and professional politicians with axes to grind and profits to be gained. The organization and jumpy prose make it difficult to follow, but it is worth the effort.

Reads like a tabloid, but can't help but feel an awful lot of it is spot on - which, of course, is really frightening. Was recommended to me by a Republican (which I am definitely not), but we both reached a lot of the same conclusions. And to believe that when I was a freshman in college and had to write a paper about a "great man," I chose LBJ. Would like to see the book get a broader audience.

I found this story to be almost unbelievable, but the author's extensive bibliography following each chapter led me to believe he may well have built a believable case. Overall, I was repulsed, disillusioned and disgusted by the revelation of how "dirty" our politics are in this supposedly most civilized of nations. I have always believed (and hoped) this type of thing was confined to the worst of third world dictatorships! I guess I have been way too naive!

Finally the only plausible leader of a conspiracy! Those claiming the Mafia solely could maintain a government wide conspiracy are on an obvious payroll of those involved. Johnson and Hoover working in tandem and their symbiotic interests are fully illuminated in this comprehensive work. Well done Mr. Stone!

The book covers very well all the dirt on LBJ and many others in his circle or within his approaches. That being said, to think that LBJ was "the man who killed Kennedy" without forces above and beyond LBJ is a tad bit naive or blind although in all fairness, the author does cover many others who were involved. As an avid assassination researcher (lower case "r"), this book certainly added to my greater understanding of Johnson's role in the whole sordid episode, but I never opened this book, thinking Johnson, was somehow at the top of this pyramid. On the other side, there does seem to be a tendency to leave Johnson out of the greater picture altogether. Perhaps this is a nice balancing act. Certainly glad I purchase and read this book.
