

This book is very concise and straight to the point. One need not to ponder over thousands of lines to find the definition and application of Lean Six Sigma tools. Easy to understand tools and techniques. It describes them in a high-level manner as there is an assumption you already know LSS. It's brief enough to skim quickly but detailed enough to refresh your memory and help you consider alternative approaches to problem solving. I find I will look through it before every LSS project I lead even if it's just to ensure I haven't skipped some important steps.

Wow. If you do any Lean or Six Sigma work, this book is for you. The tools are easy to access and have enough detail to enable a new Lean/Six Sigma user to leverage them. The book is divided into logical chapters that can help you in each purposeful step of your DMAIC journey/project. This book goes very well with Mr. George's other book, Lean Six Sigma for Service.
