


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# Developmental Reading Disabilities:: Language-Based Treatment Approach (Clinical Competence)

I found this book to be extremely useful. One of my clinical supervisors from my SLP graduate program recommended this book when I was working with elementary school students. The book is full of detailed information, and includes several useful goals, suggested materials, and information about collaborating with a school-based educational team. I agree with the previous reviews that this may be a difficult read for those that do not have a background in language studies. However, as a graduate speech-language pathology student I think this book allows the therapist to understand how to work on the evidence-based language related areas of reading.
