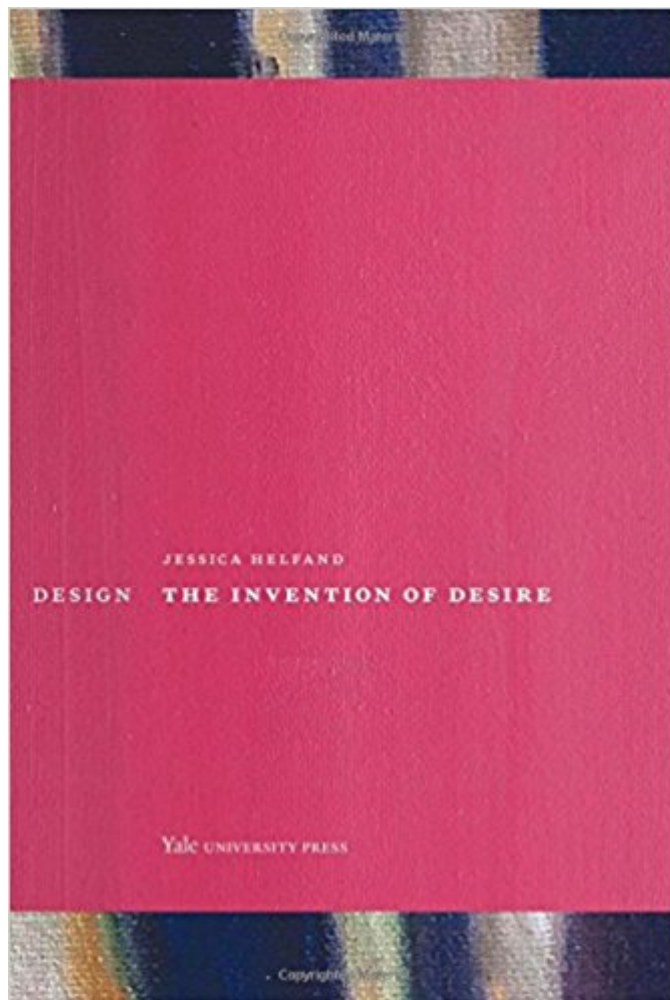

Synopsis

Design has always prided itself on being relevant to the world it serves, but interest in design was once limited to a small community of design professionals.
