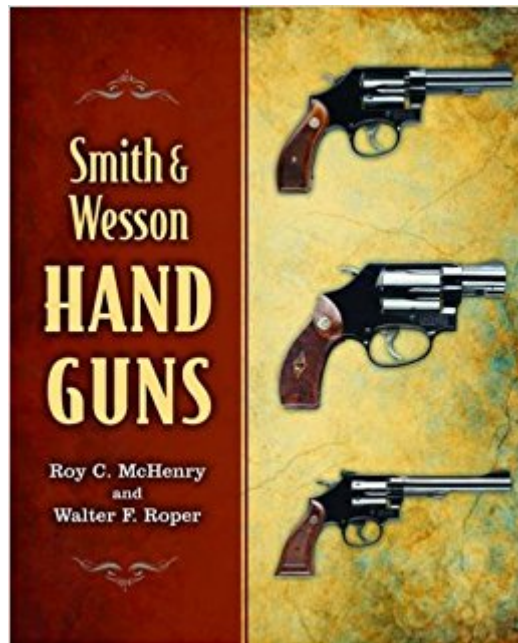

This is a reprint of a book first published in 1944. All the information is about S&W firearms up to that point (no post war models) and has some nuggets of information every S&W collector and accumulator will enjoy.

Just finished reading this! It's a great book on the subject, especially for novice collectors, such as me. It was first published in 1945, so real recent guns are not discussed and the reader must bear it's age in mind as many references to 70 - 80 year old guns are in the present tense, so seem odd. Great read and reference, though!!

Written in 1944, therefore, language is a bit archaic but the conversational style narrative is a refreshing break from dry technical volumes. Although the title says. "Smith & Wesson" there are numerous mentions of and comparisons with other brands. Plenty of tech info and illustrations for technophiles..
